1. Władysław II Jagiełło, 1386-1434	a. _____ succeeded in his efforts to proclaim the Commonwealth of Two Nations in 1568 and to ensure religious tolerance in Poland and Lithuania.
2. Władysław II Jagiełło, 1386-1434	b. _____ ruled for 40 years at a time that was known as the 'Golden Age' of Poland and the Great Duchy of Lithuania.
3. Władysław III Warneńczyk (Władysław III of Poland), 1434-1444	c. _____ will be remembered for his victory over the Teutonic Order and the Peace Treaty in Toruń in 1466.
4. Kazimierz IV Jagiellończyk (Casimir IV Jagiellon), 1447-1492	d. _____ was defeated in 1497 during his expedition to conquer Moldavia.
5. Jan I Olbracht (John I Albert), 1492-1501	e. _____ led to victory Polish and Lithuanian forces together with Witold, the Grand Duke of Lithuania in the Battle of Grunwald in 1410.
6. Aleksander Jagiellończyk (Alexander I Jagiellon), 1501-1506	f. _____ died in the Battle of Varna at the age of 20.
7. Zygmunt I Stary (Sigismund I the Old), 1506-1548	g. _____ being the last descendant of the Jagiellonian family, in 1575 she was given the title of a king.
8. Zygmunt I Stary (Sigismund I the Old), 1506-1548	h. _____ was paid homage to by Albert Hohenzollern, the Duke of Prussia in 1525 in Kraków.
9. Zygmunt II August (Sigismund II August), 1548-1572	i. _____ reigned for 48 years – the longest time in Polish history!
10. Anna Jagiellonka (Anna Jagiellon), 1575- 1587	j. _____ signed in 1505 the Act of Nihil Novi, which restricted the powers of the king.
